Looking ahead to next fall:

It's been a great year for student success in the elementary schools. You can be very proud of what your child has accomplished at school – we certainly are!! Now the challenge upon us is to begin transitioning that success into next year. Much has been learned, but a lifetime of learning is always just ahead of us, but definitely within our reach. While many elementary parents who signed open-enrollment applications for their children to attend another school next year have rescinded their intent to do so, there is still some uncertainty as to the exact number of students that will be in each classroom next fall at East Central. This has made assigning teachers to grade levels and students to individual classrooms more complicated than usual. Here are some things for you to consider as we head to summer vacation and begin planning for next fall:

- The East Central Community School District will still exist next year! Grades 7-12 will be whole-graded shared with Northeast starting next fall, but East Central will still serve grades preschool through sixth.
- The EC Board of Education has decided to maintain the use of both elementary centers next year. At this time, grades preschool, kindergarten, first, and second will be in Miles and grades four, five and six will be in Sabula. We are still trying to figure out the best placement of next year's third grade and if our small fourth grade would benefit more from being combined in a shared classroom with third graders or fifth graders. Parents of next year's fourth graders, please feel free to contact Mr. Gray to share your input.

Classroom assignments and teaching assignments may need to be re-evaluated as student numbers may change through the summer.

- Elementary shuttle bus times will be approximately the same – leaving Sabula for Miles in the morning at 7:50 and returning to Miles in the afternoon at 3:00. The same bus will leave Miles for Sabula at 8:10 in the morning and at 3:15 at the end of the day. There will be round-trip adult supervision on both daily shuttles next year.
- Elementary registration for next year will be held in Miles on June 8<sup>th</sup> and August 3<sup>rd</sup> – look for more information in the June newsletter. There will be no registration fees for next year. Class lists (for two-section grade levels) will not be finalized until August.
- **Open enrollment to another district can be rescinded at any time. It doesn't matter if a student has been registered in another district or starts the school year in another district – parents/guardians have the right to re-enroll their child in their resident school district at any time. To rescind one's open enrollment, parents/guardians simply need to notify the resident district in writing.**
- As always, we are here to serve the educational needs of your child. We look forward to working together with you to help make your child's learning at school as successful as possible – for now and for life.

## 2011-2012 REGISTRATION

East Central will be having an early registration for PK-6th grade on Wednesday, June 8th from 9a.m.-6p.m. in the Miles building. Registration will take place in the classroom across from the band room. An emergency form will need to be filled out prior to or at registration. East Central will not have a book fee or any other registration fees this year.



Northeast will be having an Open House/Early Registration on June 8th from 4-7p.m for grades 7-12.

We will also hold registration for PK-6th grade on Wednesday, August 3rd from 9-6 p.m. in the Miles building. Registration for grades 7-12 will be held at Northeast August 3rd from 9-5 p.m. at the high school. You can also register online, by going to the district website at [www.northeast.k12.ia.us](http://www.northeast.k12.ia.us), or mail the registration forms and payments to Northeast PO Box 70 Goose Lake, IA 52750. The book fee will be \$45.00. 9th grade orientation will be August 3rd at 5:00 p.m. If you register your child in June, you will not have to register in August.
